#### **Hosanna and Crucifixion**

After five weeks of preparation, we now enter Jesus heard their laments. But what does it actually mean?

Our English word 'hosanna' comes from a Greek word 'hosanna' which comes from a Hebrew phrase 'hoshiya na'. Psalm 118 is a song of entry into the holy temple, and in verse 25 it reads; 'O Lord grant us salvation, O Lord grant us success'. It means, 'save, please!' It is a cry to God for help. Jesus is the Son of David who comes in the name of the Lord, hence, the cry Hosanna (salvation) has come. Hosanna can be a cry of help or a cry of joyful praise because Christ, like a lifeguard, has come to our rescue when we are drowning in sin, darkness and tribulations.

On the other hand, Palm Sunday opens our hearts to reflect on the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ. The crowd cried out save us please and

The suffering and death of our Lord Jesus Christ is cruel and painful, but there is still joy in it as it brings freedom and reconciliation to humanity. This is an expression of total unconditional love of God towards us. When we sing 'hosanna in the highest' at Mass or say 'crucify him' during the Passion reading today and on Good Friday, we must really mean it, because our lives depend on it.

Altar Servers. We need you to come and serve for the three most important services of the year: Maundy Thursday 7pm, Good Friday 3pm and Holy Saturday 8pm. Please be in the sacristy at least 20 minutes early especially on Maundy Thursday when there are many jobs to be done. Many thanks.

Altar of Repose on Maundy Thursday. Jesus invites us as he invited his first disciples to watch and pray with him in the Garden of Gethsemane. We can do this any time after

the 7pm Mass until 11pm, before the Tabernacle on the altar of repose in the parish centre. Please come and ensure there is a large number of people praying at any time on this sacred night of our Lord's betrayal and arrest. Please enter via parish centre door (not the church).

Good Friday there will be Family Stations of the Cross in OLSG at 11am. Also, the clergy will lead the Stations of the Cross in OLSG at 7pm and OLW at 7.3opm.

Good Friday is a day of Fast and Abstinence (one main meal and snack and no meat). In accordance with Canon Law abstinence applies to those over 14 years of age. Those over 60 years of age are exempt from fasting.

The Car Park will be closed on Holy Saturday evening from 5pm because the Easter Vigil starts in the church grounds at 8pm with the blessing of the new fire and a procession into the church led by the newly lit Paschal Candle. This is followed by a party in the Parish Centre.

Please note that on Holy Saturday the normal Saturday evening Mass at 6pm is replaced by the Easter Vigil and First Mass of Easter at 8pm, and there is <u>no</u> evening Mass on Easter Sunday.

Presbytery Opening Times during Holy Week & Easter Week. Reception will close at 1.3 opm on Thursday 18th April and not be opened on Good Friday 19th April or Bank Holiday Monday 22nd April. From Tuesday 23rd to Friday 26th April reception will be open from 10am to 1.3 opm only and the church may close earlier too.

Change to Mass time on Monday 22nd April. Mass at 10am in Convent (not 7.30am) followed by refreshments. Mass at 12.30pm in OLSG.
