Confessions. Confessions are heard on **Friday 11-11.45am** and on **Saturday 5.30-6pm** in St Anne's Chapel (church entrance). Please ensure that you wear a face covering. Your confession needs to be brief, so please arrive prepared.

Mass Intentions. Due to the exceptional circumstances it is necessary for a Sunday Mass to be celebrated for more than one intention. If you have arranged to have a Mass celebrated on Sunday for a specific intention and do not wish to have that intention included with other intentions, in what is known as a Collective Intention Mass, please contact the parish office.

the Holy Souls. This year, due to COVID19 restrictions, parishioners will not be able to have direct access to the Book of Remembrance. The book will be placed before the altar for the whole month of November (instead of St George's Chapel).
