A Little Bit of Normality

There is a good and venerable tradition that at, or around, the time of the Epiphany of the Lord, the dates of Easter and other moveable feasts are announced. This year we omitted this during the Mass at Epiphany, in the interests of brevity. Therefore I reproduce the announcement here, so that we can look forward to happier times. This announcement also reminds us of the principal events of our salvation in Christ, who is the same yesterday, today and forever.

Know, brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Saviour.

On the 17th day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the 4th day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 13th day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 23rd day of May, the feast of Pentecost.

On the 6th day of June, the feast of the Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the 28th day of November, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

As this Year of Our Lord 2021 progresses, we pray that all the united and untiring efforts to combat the threat of COVID19 may prove increasingly successful, and bring us back to a more regular pattern of life and community. Meanwhile, let us support one another in every way that we can. Do let the clergy know if we can be of any help at all, especially to those who are sick, lonely and isolated at this time.
