One thing lacking

The Gospel passage given to us for this Sunday is striking in its clarity. The 'man of great wealth' is enthusiastic and open to the message of Jesus. However, there is a serious problem. He is attached to his wealth and to things as they are. The Lord loves him, but notices this attachment and, in the modern parlance, 'calls it out.' The man (who is often called young and rich) walks away sad, unable and unwilling to change.

Here is the Gospel call and the cost of discipleship in miniature. Like the young man, we are dared to approach and to ask what God is asking of us. The answer may well differ for each one of us, but the same radical and heart felt response is required each time. We may prayerfully ask these simple questions of ourselves:

'What do I hold dear?

And, following on from that:

'Is it a healthy attachment?'

And, following on from that:

'What must I do to inherit eternal life?'

The answers may well be demanding, but, in the light of the story of the rich young man, we can see how the challenge and wisdom they offer is essential to our faith and to our relationship with Christ.

We have just celebrated the feast of St John Henry Newman. This prayer of his catches the spirit of radical and loving discipleship very well:

Dear Lord, help me to spread your fragrance wherever I go.

Flood my soul with your spirit and life.

Penetrate and possess my whole being so utterly that all my life may only be a radiance of yours.

Shine through me, and be so in me that every soul I come in contact with

may feel your presence in my soul.

Let them look up and see no longer me, but only you, O Lord!

Stay with me and then I will begin to shine as you do; so to shine as to be a light to others.

The light, O Lord, will be all from you; none of it will be mine. It will be you shining on others through me.

Let me thus praise you in the way which you love best, by shining on those around me.

Let me preach you without preaching,

not by words but by example, by the catching force, the sympathetic influence of what I do,

the evident fullness of the love my heart bears to you.

Amen.
