# Praying the Liturgy of the Hours with us

One of the important vows and commitments that Father Daniel, Deacon Peter and I made (as priests and deacons), is to pray the Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office. This liturgical prayer is an integral part of our daily life and ministry. It is an important practice for us as Christians, because it sanctifies time, nourishes our spiritual life, and connects us to the Church's prayerful rhythm, as these prayers are recited by all Catholic priests, deacons and religious around the world. One of the many signs of the true universality of our Church. In short, the structure of the Liturgy of 5. Hours consists of:

- Morning Prayer (Lauds): typically prayed in the morning, it includes hymns, psalms, a scripture reading, the Benedictus (Canticle of Zechariah), intercessions, and the Lord's Prayer.
- 2. Midmorning Prayer (Terce), Midday Prayer (Sext), and Mid-afternoon Prayer (None): these are shorter "Daytime Prayers" which can be prayed throughout the day.

- Evening Prayer (Vespers): celebrated in the early evening, it includes hymns, psalms, a scripture reading, the Magnificat (Canticle of Mary), intercessions, and the Lord's Prayer.
- Night Prayer (Compline): Prayed before bedtime, it comprises psalms, a short scripture reading, the Nunc Dimittis (Canticle of Simeon), prayers for protection during the night, and the Lord's Prayer.
- Office of Readings (Matins): A flexible and often longer prayer time which can be prayed at any time of the day. It includes more extensive scripture readings.

At 7.30am every morning Father Daniel and I pray, recite and sing Morning Prayer (Lauds) in church, lasting around 15 minutes. You are more than welcome to join us. Maybe before you head to work in the morning, or before you start your day, you can pray alongside us and join us in these beautiful prayers of the Church.
