A Revolution is upon us!

Today's reading from Jeremiah is a prophecy of the greatest revolution in history! There have been many revolutions in world history: the invention of the wheel, innovative Iron Age tools in farming, revolutions against many political tyrants, and against slavery. There have been evil (for example the Nazi revolution) as well as good revolutions (abolishing slavery, the invention of penicillin in 1928). But the first and foremost revolution was our revolution against God, the fall of the whole human race in Adam and Eve, our first parents.

However these are not the greatest revolutions. They are all man-made revolutions. But the greatest revolutions are always the ones God made. Creation was the first: a revolution against nothingness. Creation makes the difference between nothing and something. That's the most revolutionary difference of all. The difference between oppression and freedom is great, of course, and so is the difference between the fear of fire and the control of fire, but they are only relative differences; but there is an absolute difference between nothing and everything in the universe.

The creation of the human soul was the second revolution, because the difference between a

human soul and a body is another absolute difference. There is a great difference between the human body and the animal body, between human biology and animal biology, but it's only relative. Ninety percent of our DNA we have in common with some animals. But there is an absolute difference between an animal and a person with a spiritual soul, with reason and conscience and free will and a relationship with God.

Once He created mankind, God made a series of covenants with us: with Adam; with Noah; with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; with Moses; with David; and with his chosen people collectively. Then, in the greatest revolution of all, God became man. The divine Son of God the Father became a human being, Jesus Christ, to suffer and die to save us from eternal death. The Incarnation was the greatest revolution and also the greatest covenant, the New Covenant, or New Testament. "Covenant" and "testament" are synonyms. This is what Jeremiah in our First Reading foretells.

Also, on this St. Patrick's Day, may the wisdom of St. Patrick inspire us, his faith guide us, and his



love for God be reflected in our actions.

And remember, he didn't need luck because he had faith!
