	Objective truth and Subjective Response	

Today's First Reading is from the first sermon Christian lives? We hear the objective facts at of the first pope, St Peter (Acts 3:13-19).

It is therefore a very special reading. It contains a pattern that we find in most sermons, homilies, encyclicals, exhortations or church writings. The pattern is simple, it has two parts: first a statement of objective facts takes place, followed by an encouraging of a subjective, personal response.

In the first part Peter is telling us the objective facts of who God is, and how he sent his Son into the world. He then states to all the faithful listening to his homily how they all then crucified him, asserting our human sin which nailed him to the cross. Those are all objective facts indeed. The second half of his sermon then states how our subjective response should be in light of all this: to repent and convert.

every Mass. So what is our subjective response? Peter's answer is always that we should convert. The word "conversion" originates from the Latin word "con-vertere", which means "to turn around", to 'vert' back to God. We are always asked to turn back to God.

Both the objective half and the subjective half are necessary. If we only know the objective truths and stuff ourselves with pure knowledge, then we won't have a personal relationship with Christ. Or on the contrary, if we only have a personal response without looking at the objective facts, then we are in danger of turning God into a personal 'à-lacarte' god where we pick and choose who we want him to be for us. It is a delicate balance that we are all constantly invited to in our Catholic faith: knowledge of the objective truths AND our subjective response. Both are

It is a beautiful, short reading, well worth needed. It is not an 'either/or', but it is a spending a bit of time on. But doesn't this 'both/and'. also illustrate the dynamics of our whole
