Holy Week Services—the schedule is now available for you to take home with you or to peruse on the parish website. We are looking forward to the annual celebration of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord. Please would parishioners note the following regarding Palm Sunday:

The 10.30 am Mass at OLSG next Sunday will commence with the Blessing of Palms and Procession. This will begin in the car park. This means that the car park at OLSG will close after the 9 am Mass (except for the part nearest to the Parish Centre which will remain open). Stewards will stand at the entrance to the car park to deter those who have not read this notice). It will still be possible to drop off those who find it difficult to walk. The car park will open again once the procession has gone into the church. Additionally, the Mass which usually commences at 12 noon will move to 12.15 pm for Palm Sunday only. Please note that there is also a liturgy at 7 pm on Good Friday evening at Our Lady of Walsingham.
