June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Dear brothers and sisters, to approach the subject of the Holy Trinity is not easy because we tend to view the Trinity as a concept rather than God, an experience that God has within himself, and with us.

Let me try to explain in human terms:

When a woman gives birth she knows that child is part of her union with her husband, the child has attributes of both parents, and usually a result of the love these people would have for each other in marriage, which makes them 'one flesh' which bring forth this child.

Each have a unique role and responsibility, mother nurtures and loves, father protects and provides, **in communion with his wife**, and the child brings joy to their lives, because s/he is part of their unity. Of course it is not a perfect example, but nevertheless an example that we can understand.

Now this can also be a concept for us. Perhaps one has not experienced this kind of love in one's life. But this is why the Trinity is important because in the Gospel of John we hear that Jesus says to his disciples.

Philip said to him, 'Lord, show us the Father,

and we will be satisfied.' Jesus said to him, 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, "Show us the Father"? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. 'If you love me, you will keep^f my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you for ever. (John 14)

In other words the Mystery of the Trinity is something we can only comprehend intellectually with an experience of love. When there is love there is unity, and when that unity is in God then it has a direction.

That direction requires our freedom to look for the good of the other, because we have known that donation of our time and self has not caused us to disappear, or even lose ourselves, but actually find who we really are, and our importance to God's plan.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and To the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning is now and ever shall be world without end .
